

## Where there's a Will!


Use your research skills to answer these questions using the Museum's website.

## Each question features a real life William from Cambridge's histories.

1. George Russell Fellow was the bricklayer who built the Cambridge water tower in 1903. It cost £1,077. to build. What was the name of the man and his son who with their horse 'Darkie', helped pulley the bricks to the top of the tower during construction?
2. Among the villa style houses of Cambridge is 'Orongo' on the corner of Thornton and Victoria Roads that was built in 1902. Its name is taken from the district in Thames that its first owner came from. Who was the first owner that it was built for?
3. In what year did Willie Arakatera enrol at Cambridge Primary School?
4.Fen Court was bought from the Bank of New Zealand (for £4 10/-an acre) by the Government. Who was the manager of the Fen Court Estate in 1898?
5.In 1867 the Armed Constabulary Act was passed. A Lieutenant-Colonel raised two divisions of Armed Constabulary and commanded one himself (No. 4 division) with the headquarters in Cambridge. The other (No. 5 division) was commanded by Major von Tempsky at Alexandra (Pirongia). What was the name of the Lieutenant-Colonel who commanded No. 4 division?
