Pirongia Heritage and Information Centre


- Customer Experience meet and greet visitors, show them around the facility and assist with family history requests.



Frequently asked questions

Can anyone volunteer?

Anyone over the age of 16 can volunteer in the heritage facilities.

What skills will I need to become a volunteer?

You won't need any specific skills to become a volunteer. However, customer service, cataloguing/archiving, word processing, a love of history and passion for museums will help you out.

Will I need an in-depth knowledge of the history of Waipā?

Training will be provided which will include where to refer visitors for more information. However, a love of history would be an advantage.

How much time will I have to give?

As much time as you want to. Most of our volunteers work around two to three hours per week, based on the project.

What tasks will I be asked to do?

Waipā Heritage Facilities have several different types of tasks we are seeking volunteers for. You will be asked to do a task that best fits your interests.

What training will I receive?

You will receive an induction session and we will provide all the training that you need.

Do I have to be onsite to complete projects?

Not all projects have to be completed at the facility. Some projects such as sewing and archive transcription can be done at home. You will need to come to the facility for an interview and induction/briefing.

Is there a volunteer application process?

We have volunteer application forms, and we would like to have a chat with you in person. There is also an agreement that we will ask you to sign.
